



What the changes mean for your practice



Our new model for CHCP/CHPL will have two hubs and their branch sites. The opening times and the people who will work at these sites are below.

We would like to have two main sites, consisting of three practices supported by branch sites. For CHCP, the main site will be in Wilberforce Health Centre, where The Quays Medical Practice and East Park Practice will both be based. Doing this will mean that the practice will have a team of skilled clinicians from different professions looking after our patients. The main practice will be supported by one branch practice, located at Riverside Medical Practice; Kingston Medical Practice will cease to operate as a branch site. Patients registered at any of our CHCP practices will be registered with either The Quays or East Park Practice but will be able to come to Wilberforce or Riverside for appointments.

CHPL will operate one main site at Southcoates Medical Practice, supported by branch practices at Field View and Bransholme. CHPL Marfleet Lane Practice will cease to operate as a branch site. All patients will be registered under the main site at Southcoates but will be able to come to either Southcoates, Field View or Bransholme depending on their preference and appointment.
